YYYY-MM-DD _Category_ Description _Vendor

5 GOLDEN RULES

- 1

Date first — always. YYYY-MM-DD format sorts chronologically in every folder, automatically.
- 2

Underscores between elements, hyphens within words. Office_Supplies → Office-Supplies.
- 3

2–4 word descriptions. Keep it short. If you need a sentence, it's too long.
- 4

No spaces or special chars. Letters, numbers, hyphens, and underscores only.
- 5

Save as PDF. Most universal and compact format for scanned documents.
- ✓

Consistent vendor names. Pick one spelling and stick with it (e.g., always "HomeDepot").

No year subfolders needed — the YYYY-MM-DD prefix sorts files chronologically within each folder automatically.

PRO TIPS



Use Your OS Search

With this convention, Windows Search instantly finds files by date, category code, description, or vendor. No special software needed.



Works Everywhere

This system works on your computer, Google Drive, Dropbox, OneDrive — any platform that sorts alphabetically.



Category Codes Are Instant Context

Glance at any folder: RCT = receipt, TAX = tax-related, CTR = contract. You know what you're looking at without opening a single file.



Short Descriptions Win

"Office-Supplies" is enough. You don't need "Office-Supplies-Purchased-At-Staples-For-The-Printer-In-The-Back-Room."



One Formula, Every File

Receipts, contracts, medical records, tax docs — they all follow the same pattern. Learn it once, use it forever.



Start Today

Don't try to rename old files. Start using this convention now. Over time, your organized files will outnumber the chaos.
